## 1. Hyderabad (Telangana)

#### **Regulatory Authority**

• Telangana State Pollution Control Board (TSPCB)

#### **Key Requirements**

- Sewage Treatment Standards: Follow the Andhra Pradesh Water, Land, and Trees Act along with the Environmental Protection Act.
- Effluent Discharge Standards: Meet specified limits for pH, BOD, TSS, and FC as per TSPCB guidelines.
- **Monitoring:** Regular monitoring and submission of effluent quality reports to TSPCB.
- **Permits:** Obtain necessary consents for establishment and operation.

## 2. Bangalore (Karnataka)

#### **Regulatory Authority**

• Karnataka State Pollution Control Board (KSPCB)

#### **Key Requirements**

- Sewage Treatment Standards: Comply with the Karnataka State Water Policy and the Environmental Protection Act.
- Effluent Standards: Adhere to limits for pH, BOD, TSS, and FC.
- Monitoring Frequency: Monthly for major industries; quarterly for smaller facilities.
- Permits: Secure necessary consents from KSPCB before operations begin.

## 3. Chennai (Tamil Nadu)

## **Regulatory Authority**

• Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB)

### **Key Requirements**

- Sewage Treatment Standards: Adhere to the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974.
- Effluent Discharge Standards: Comply with TNPCB's specified standards for industrial discharges and sewage treatment.
- Monitoring Protocols: Regular monitoring and reporting as per consent conditions.
- Consents: Obtain Consent to Establish (CTE) and Consent to Operate (CTO).

## 4. Pune (Maharashtra)

### **Regulatory Authority**

• Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB)

#### **Key Requirements**

- **Sewage Treatment Standards:** Follow guidelines set by the Maharashtra Water Pollution Control Act and the Environmental Protection Act.
- Effluent Discharge Standards: Comply with MPCB's standards for pH, BOD, TSS, and FC.
- Monitoring Frequency: Monthly for major industries; quarterly for minor facilities.
- **Permits:** Acquire Consent to Establish (CTE) and Consent to Operate (CTO) from MPCB before commencing operations.
